February 4th was the official birthday of the organization known as [United Service Organizations](https://www.uso.org/) or USO. The USO has been a fixture in military life for more than seven decades. Founded in 1941, the agency is a private, not-for-profit organization working in cooperation with the Department of Defense. USO facilities are open to all with current, unexpired military ID cards including dependents and retirees. But you do not have to be associated with the military in order to volunteer or help out with the USO mission. You can learn more about USO facilities and volunteer opportunities at the [USO official site](https://www.uso.org/). Today the USO offers help for military families including being an emergency contact resource for troops stationed overseas. If there is a death in the family or other crisis, family members can contact troops stationed overseas via the USO and get financial assistance with travel back home to attend funeral services, be present for sick or injured loved ones, and more.
