#### **HISTORY WITH JOSH**

Josh Quackenbush, SAL member, has volunteered to provide us with a brief article on military history each month. This month Josh has chosen to write about his grandfather, Delmer F Quackenbush.

Shortly after my wife and I moved to Cary my neighbor asked me if I had a relative who served on the USS North Carolina. I was surprised to find out that my Grandfather Delmer F Quackenbush had and that his name was among those found on its officer's plaque. During my Grandfather's long naval career he served on many ships and at our nation's capital. All the years I knew him, he kept silent about his

service during WWII. All I knew is what my father told me, that he had survived the bombing of Pearl Harbor and that he never talked about it.

I cherish the memories that I do have of my Grandfather who lived in Anaheim, California not far from the original Disneyland. His discipline and devotion to duty always made a strong impression on me. I remember when recycling first became a thing back in the 70's, he was among the first to jump on board. He played the trumpet and was a member of the Anaheim Symphonic Orchestra and prestigious bands. He later directed his own dance band called Del and His Pals. They played for social and civic events and even came out to Joshua Tree where I lived to perform for a large crowd. I remember another time when he came to visit our family in Lake Tahoe. He was in his 70's and I was absolutely amazed to see him bravely dive off a pier into the cold lake.

After my Grandfather died I inherited his naval officer's sword that has his name engraved on it. This was kind of a big deal considering he had a large family of ten children and 22 grandchildren. Later I recovered the archival documents showing that he had served on board the USS Sumner,

not far from Battleship Row. He wrote the after action report for the USS Sumner on December 7, 1941. One of his crew mates had shot down a Japanese zero that attempted a torpedo attack on the USS California which was the southernmost ship along Battleship Row.

In 2009, I realized the number of World War II veterans were dwindling quickly and a strong sense of urgency propelled me to travel throughout the United States to collect the oral histories of those who served for posterity. In the comfort of their homes, the veterans spoke candidly, opening their lives and sharing their fears. With amazement, I heard their experiences of facing elite German units, escaping from blown out tanks, surviving sinking ships, parachuting out of burning planes, and being captured and sent to POW camps. Those who fought on the front lines fostered within me a deeper understanding of the extreme efforts it took to free the world of Nazism. To mark the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of some of the major campaigns fought in WWII, I will be posting some of the interviews I conducted with veterans.






